Ladies and Gentlemen:

On behalf of our client Covenant Network, licensee of FM Broadcast Station WOLG, Carlinville, Illinois, there is submitted herewith pursuant to 47 C.F.R. §73.1560(d) a request for WOLG to operate a reduced power.

The WOLG main transmitter has malfunctioned due to a tube which will only permit the station to generate 75% of its required transmitter power output (TPO). Covenant Network ordered a rebuild of this tube, but the rebuilt tube was only able to permit the generation of only 50% of the required TPO. As the transmitter has sustained other damage due to arcing, Covenant Network has determined to acquire a solid state transmitter as a replacement.

Therefore, this is to request a 180 day special temporary authorization for WOLG(FM) to operate at reduced power. The public interest, convenience and necessity would be well served, as such an STA will permit WOLG(FM) to remain on the air to serve the Carlinville area in south central Illinois.

An "Anti-Drug Abuse Certification" is attached hereto.

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We are filing this request in PDF format pursuant to the Commission's Public Notice, DA 22-29, released January 11, 2022.

As WOLG(FM) is licensed as a non-commercial educational FM station, this submission is exempt from the payment of FCC application processing fees pursuant to 47 C.F.R. §1.1116(c).
