KMON(AM), Great Falls, Montana (FIN 62330)

Dear Sir or Madam:

On behalf of CCR-Great Falls IV, LLC (“Cherry Creek”) (FRN 0009737313), licensee of the above-referenced station, pursuant to the Audio Division guidance issued on January 11, 2022 and January 25, 2022, we respectfully request special temporary authority for the station to operate at variance as described further below.

Due to issues with the station’s nighttime directional antenna system, the station has been operating with 1,000 watts at night on the daytime non-directional tower, instead of its licensed 5,000 watts directional parameters. Daytime operations are unaffected. The station’s engineers are working to resolve the issue. Special temporary authority is respectfully requested to allow this work to continue. Cherry Creek will promptly notify the Commission when the station is able to resume licensed operations.

Undersigned counsel has been authorized by Cherry Creek to state that neither Cherry Creek nor any party to this application is subject to a denial of federal benefits pursuant to Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988, 21 U.S.C. § 862.
