**Notification of License Cancellation** 

## Dear Licensee:

This letter is to inform you that the license of Station K242AN, Lebanon, Missouri (Station), licensed to The Curators of the University of Missouri (University), has expired pursuant to Section 312(g) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (Act).<sup>1</sup>

On January 24, 2022, we sent you a letter stating that our records indicated that the Station had been off the air since at least August 3, 2020.<sup>2</sup> University was required to clarify this matter in writing within forty-five days of the date of the Letter. To date we have received no response.<sup>3</sup>

Therefore, the Commission's public and internal databases HAVE BEEN MODIFIED to indicate that the broadcast license for the referenced station is EXPIRED, that the station's license is CANCELLED as a matter of law, and that the station's call sign is DELETED. The license renewal application for the Station, File No. 0000123768, is also DISMISSED.

Finally, we note that it is imperative to the safety of air navigation that any prescribed painting and illumination of the station's tower be maintained until the tower is dismantled. Accordingly, the

owner of the tower where the referenced station's transmitting antenna is located is required to maintain the tower in the manner prescribed by our rules and the terms of the cancelled license.<sup>4</sup>
