Dear Madam Secretary:

On behalf of Endurance Broadcasting, LLC, licensee of the above-referenced station, you are respectfully requested to extend special temporary authority for station KLBB to continue operating at an alternate tower site with a drop-wire antenna at 0.020 kW reduced power due to the loss of the licensed site.

KLBB is a small market stand-alone AM station licensed to a small business and operating at reduced power with a commensurately reduced service area and revenue potential.

Locating a workable replacement tower site has proved challenging to date. During the most recent STA period, KLBB continued its search for potential alternate sites, which included possibly co-locating the KLBB antenna at an existing tower site controlled by an unrelated radio licensee. Discussion with one such site owner has developed to a stage where the site owner has made an unexpected offer to acquire KLBB contingent upon co-locating KLBB's tower site and the parties have entered preliminary contract discussion. The potential buyer prefers to prepare the required CP application and manage the co-location project itself after the parties reach a meeting of the minds on a mutually agreeable asset purchase agreement.


