Dear Madam Secretary:

On behalf of Perry Broadcasting Systems, licensee of the above-referenced station, you are respectfully requested to extend special temporary authority for station WBSG to continue DA operation at a maximum 1000 watts while maintaining monitor points within licensed limits.

During this STA period, the licensee anticipated filing Form 302 to cover the re-built antenna site provided that the necessary technical assistance was available and WBSG encountered no performance issues during the new equipment operational break-in period. However, the engineer performing tower site work encountered unanticipated professional obligations at other broadcast transmitter sites that did not permit him to complete final equipment calibrations at WBSG or prepare the anticipated broadcast license application. At present, the engineer is scheduled to resume work at WBSG between the months of August to October 2022, barring further unanticipated schedule availability complications.

STA is in the public interest so that the station may continue to broadcast important information to its listening audience until repairs may be completed.

Applicant certifies that neither applicant nor any party to the application is subject to denial of federal benefits pursuant to Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988, 21 U.S.C. Section 862.
