Pharis Broadcasting, Inc. ("Pharis"), licensee of AM radio station KFPW, Ft. Smith, Arkansas, and pursuant to Section 73.1635 of the FCC's rules, hereby requests Special Temporary Authorization ("STA") to operate the station at reduced power using a temporary backup transmitter pending necessary repairs caused by a technical issue beyond its control. No other technical changes have occurred.

The station experienced complete failure of its licensed transmitter and began been operating at the reduced power of 30 watts with a temporary backup transmitter on [August 23, 2022]. The station's contract engineer is investigating the situation and working to determine the cause of the transmitter failure. Given its age, however, the manufacturer no longer supports the licensed transmitter model, and acquiring replacement parts is expected to be a difficult and lengthy undertaking. Once the cause of the transmitter failure is determined, Pharis will proceed with either repair or replacement as quickly as possible.

A grant of reduced power STA for 180 days will provide the time need to determine the cause of the transmitter failure, complete the necessary repairs or replacement, and will serve the public interest by allowing Pharis to maintain without interruption, the station's current radio operation for its local community.
