WFBR(AM) Request to Extend Special Temporary Authorization

Way Broadcasting Licensee, LLC (“Way”), licensee of Station WFBR(AM), Glen Burnie, Maryland (Fac. ID 19673), respectfully requests a further extension of its Special Temporary Authorization (“STA”), pursuant to Sections 73.1635 and 73.68(e) of the Commission’s rules, to operate this Station without certain required equipment that prohibits the use of its antenna monitor.

The Commission is aware that the WFBR transmitter site has been repeatedly vandalized. Way reported that thieves stole portions of two WFBR sample lines rendering the antenna monitor unusable. Way’s field engineer continues to take monitor point measurements to ensure licensed operation is maintained.

Since the submission of its last Extension Request, Way’s new Chief Financial Officer has been conferring with its new consulting engineer to determine what equipment needs to be repaired or replaced to eliminate this STA. Until they are able to craft an appropriate technical plan, Way respectfully requests a further extension of its STA to operate without portions of its sample lines. This will allow listeners in the Glen Burnie to continue to receive service.
