We are requesting a final extension of the STA (File Number BSTA-20220218AAF) to operate WECU – 1570 AM at a reduced daytime power of 1000 watts from its existing transmitter site in Winterville, NC. It is scheduled to expire February 21, 2023. We have decided to repurpose our 10000 watt LPB transmitter (due to an inability to source necessary parts at full power) but instead to operate at 2500 watts. We are currently operating on the STA with our 1000 watt LPB backup transmitter to operate WECU at a reduced daytime power of 1000 watts. We continue to operate at our nighttime licensed power of 200 watts. We anticipate we should have an operating transmitter at 2500 watts within a few months and as such we are filing a minor modification concurrently with this STA extension to operate WECU with a new license with 2500 watts day and 200 watts night. I have attached this minor modification Form 301-AM along with this STA request.
