STU-COMM, INC. EDUCATIONAL PURPOSE STATEMENT

On behalf of Stu-Comm, Inc., licensee of WRJR(AM), Claremont, Virginia, the ("Station"), we submit this statement of educational purpose in connection with the Station.

Stu-Comm, Inc. is a non-profit corporation with an educational objective and will use WRJR(AM) for the advancement of an educational program to further that objective. StuComm was incorporated and registered with the Virginia Corporation Commission as a nonprofit corporation in 1993. In 1996, Stu-Comm's WNRN(FM), Charlottesville, Virginia began broadcasting. Stu-Comm's mission is to connect communities through music, art and education. Stu-Comm is committed to presenting the optimal mix of existing and new programming to better serve its stations' listeners. This includes supporting independent music from local and national sources; linking listeners with numerous nonprofits and cultural organizations involved in supporting our local community; exploring social issues and educating volunteers and interns in all aspects of radio. Stu-Comm partners with local community foundations to bring to light the needs of the communities it serves and what is available to solve problems. Stu-Comm regularly reaches out to non-profits that work in the areas of aging in place, art in place, school readiness, mental health and wellness, job readiness, water and land conservation, transportation, affordable housing, food security, and community health.

Stu-Comm intends to use noncommercial WRJR(AM) to publicize its various community services and to further its mission through meaningful educational programming and community outreach, including the following:

- 90 second profiles of community organizations and the issues they face, rotated hourly throughout the broadcast day
- Regular daily programming featuring music and performance from local bands:
 - 60 second PSAs written and voiced by community participants; and
 - Informing the public of arts and cultural events.

Other uses of the Station would include organization of an advisory committee on matters of local importance to local residents to help inform its community organization profiles; educational, cultural and entertainment programs that Stu-Comm determines are appealing to the citizens of The Tidewater region; interviews with local civic and religious leaders; live concerts; and teen programming, involving young members of the community. All programming on the Station will be noncommercial in nature, with no

advertisements, and no support for or opposition to a candidate for political office.
