Dear Counsel:

This is in reference to the request filed December 12, 2008, on behalf of Ontario Broadcasting, LLC ("OB"). OB requests special temporary authority ("STA") to operate Station KSPA with facilities proposed in pending Application BP-20041115AFC.¹ For reasons which are discussed herein, the request is denied.

In support of the request, OB states that its application, which would provide a first local transmission service to the city of Chino, has been pending for more than four years due to a conflict with two applications for Culver city, CA, filed in AM Auction No. 84. OB gives three examples where "The FCC has granted STAs in the past in cimilar circumstances..."² i.e., Stations WGDL(AM), Lares, PR;³ WJZG(FM), Cuelebra, PR⁴ and KSKY(AM) Balch City, TX.⁵

Our review indicates that OB has failed to demonstrate that the Public Interest would be served by grant of its request. STA is not the appropriate vehicle for the establishment of new broadcast service in circumvention of the two-step construction permit and license process which is mandated by the Communications Act of 1934.⁶ OB's technical proposal in BP-20041115AFC

has not been subjected to a thorough engineering review by the Staff, and there is no guarantee that the proposal is grantable. Moreover, OB's application is in queue behind the ultimate auction winner at Culver City.⁷ Once the winner has been determined and its final technical proposal has been filed, OB must amend its application to protect the Culver City proposal, or risk dismissal. The proposed STA operation would involve a substantial extension of the daytime and nighttime coverage contours, with no guarantee that the service provided by the proposed STA operation could ever be licensed.

With respect to OB's reliance on the WGDL, WJZG and KSKY STA grants, we note initially that unpublished staff letters are binding only on persons with actual notice of those letters and may not be relied upon, cited or used as precedent.⁸ Even so, these cases are readily distinguishable from OB's proposal. Station WGDL was licensed for operation on 1200 kHz with 0.25 kW, daytime hours only. It filed Application BP-19900326ID, which proposed operation on 1200 kHz with 1 kilowatt, unlimited hours.⁹ A staff review of its application indicated that the only station which prevented grant of its proposal, HIBS, San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic, had been authorized to change frequency from 1200 kHz to 670 kHz, and that Station HIBS had actually commenced operation on 670 kHz. However, the Dominican government did not remove the allocation formerly occupied by HIBS on 1200 kHz from the IFRB¹⁰ records, even though no Dominican station was operating on that frequency. In coordination with the International Bureau, Station WGDL was granted STA to operate with the facilities proposed in its application, with the condition that, should Station HIBS return to operation on 1200 kHz, Station WGDL must revert to its licensed parameters. In contrast to the uncertainty of the outcome of the Culver City proposals which bar grant of KSPA's application, the single station in conflict with WGDL's proposal had already relocated its operation to another channel; it was a virtual certainty that it would not return to its former frequency, and the only impediment to implementation of WGDL's power increase was an apparent ministerial error on the part of the Dominican government.

The case of Station WJZG is likewise readily distinguishible from OB's instant proposal. On June 23, 1995, the Commission granted Construction Permit BPH-19911114MS, which authorized a new FM station at Culebra, PR, on Channel 293A (106.5 MHz), to Aurio A. Matos ("Matos"). Shortly thereafter, the Commission modified the operating frequency of the new, unbuilt station from Channel 293 to Channel 254 (98.7 MHz) in order to accommodate a multiple-station channel swap in MM Docket No. 91-259.¹¹ While the original permit on Channel 293 contained no special operating condition which prevented immediate

commencement of operation, the modified permit for Channel 254 was conditioned on implementation of a channel change for Station WSAN in MM Docket No. 91-259. Rather than implement the channel changes ordered in MM Docket No. 91-259, the several stations became embroiled in a legal dispute over reimbursement of the expenses incurred in the channel changes. The dispute dragged on until, in April, 1998, Matos commenced operation on its original channel and filed an application for license. The Commission dismissed the license application as patently defective and initiated an enforcement proceeding against Matos for operating on an unauthorized channel, which resulted in a monetary forfeiture.¹² After receiving several thousand letters from the public protesting the removal of the new radio service from Culebra, the Commission granted STA to Matos to resume operation on Channel 293. The distinction between the matter of WJZG and OB's instant proposal is that Station WJZG had received a construction permit for its operation on Channel 293 before the permit was modified to specify operation on Channel 254 in MM Docket No. 91-259 and that its STA facilities were, in effect, those previously authorized by the Commission. In contrast, Station KSPA has never been granted a construction permit for its proposed operation at Chino.

Station KSKY sought and was granted STA to rebroadcast the AM station's programming on three FM translators, due to massive interference received from two Mexican AM stations operating in contravention of their notified parameters. As such, this case has no bearing on OB's proposal to increase the power of its AM operation via STA.

Finally, nothing in OB's request indicates that Station KSPA is unable to continue operating as licensed and thereby to provide service to the community of Ontario. Thus, the "extraordinary circumstances"¹³ which warrant operation at variance from currently licensed parameters via STA do not exist.

Accordingly, the request for STA IS HEREBY DENIED. This action is taken pursuant to 47 CFR Section 0.283.
