Applications for New AM Station Construction Permits

Dear Applicants:

We have before us the above-captioned mutually exclusive (“MX”) AM construction permit applications.¹ Ann Arbor First Ventures, LP (“AAFV”) proposes a major change in the licensed facility of Station WAAM(AM), Ann Arbor, Michigan, to change community of license from Ann Arbor to Oak Park, Michigan.² Lexington Park Broadcasters, Inc. (“Lexington Park”) proposes a new AM station at Ada, Michigan. Barbara Lynch (“Lynch”) proposes a new AM station at Boyne Falls, Michigan. Lynch also proposes new AM stations at Elk Rapids, Michigan; Mancelona, Michigan; and Harbor Springs, Michigan. These applications were included in MX Group 84-50 in AM Auction No. 84. We also have before us: (1) a Joint Request for Approval of Settlement Agreement and Withdrawal (“Settlement Agreement 50-S1”) filed October 28, 2005, by AAFV and Lexington Park; (2) a Joint Request for Approval of Settlement Agreement and Withdrawal (“Settlement Agreement 50-S2”) filed October 26, 2005, by AAFV and Lynch; and (3) a Form 301 long-form application filed by AAFV on October 31, 2005.³ As discussed below, we approve both Settlement Agreements, dismiss the Lexington Park and Lynch applications, and dismiss AAFV’s Form 301 long-form application and its tech box application, per AAFV’s March 11, 2009, request.

Background. On June 15, 2005, the Media Bureau released a *Public Notice* containing a list of 802 MX AM Auction No. 84 window-filed Form 301 tech box applications.⁴ The *AM MX Public Notice* defined three categories of MX applications, detailed the filings required for each category, and specified a September 16, 2005, deadline for submitting the required filings to the Commission. This filing deadline was extended to October 31, 2005, because of Hurricane Katrina.⁵ MX Group 84-50 was listed as a Category I MX group, eligible for settlement. Category I applicants were required to file a settlement agreement, an engineering solution resolving all mutual exclusivities, or a Section 307(b) showing by the filing deadline.

On October 28, 2005, AAFV and Lexington Park filed Settlement Agreement 50-S1. Under the terms of Settlement Agreement 50-S1, AAFV is to reimburse Lexington Park for its legitimate and prudent expenses in exchange for the withdrawal of its Ada, Michigan, tech box application. On October 26, 2005, AAFV and Lynch filed Settlement Agreement 50-S2. Under the terms of Settlement Agreement 50-S2, AAFV is to reimburse Lynch for her legitimate and prudent expenses in exchange for the withdrawal of her Boyne Falls, Elk Rapids, Mancelona, and Harbor Springs, Michigan tech box applications. Along with the Settlement Agreements, AAFV filed a complete Form 301 long-form application for its major change at Station WAAM(AM). Both Settlement Agreements contain the affidavits required by Section 73.3525(a) of the Commission's Rules ("Rules").⁶

Discussion. *The Settlement Agreements.* After careful consideration of the Settlement Agreements, and the attached affidavits, we find that approval of the Settlement Agreements would serve the public interest and expedite the provision of new AM service. The applicants have complied with Section 311(c)(3) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (the "Act") and Section 73.3525(a) of the Rules.⁷ We further find that none of the parties filed their respective applications for the purpose of reaching or carrying out the Settlement Agreement⁸ and that no consideration, other than as provided by the Settlement Agreement, has been directly or indirectly paid or promised. AAFV's long-form application was accepted for filing and placed on Public Notice on April 28, 2008.⁹ On March 11, 2009, AAFV requested that its long-form and tech box applications be dismissed.

Section 307(b) Issue. Republication. Since the applicants propose to serve different communities, the parties have demonstrated that dismissal of the Lexington Park and Lynch applications would not unduly impede the objectives of Section 307(b) of the Act.¹⁰ Accordingly, we will not require republication under Section 73.3525(b) of the Rules.¹¹

Conclusion. Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED, that the Joint Request for Approval of Settlement Agreement and Withdrawal filed October 28, 2005, by AAFV and Lexington Park, and the Joint Request for Approval of Settlement Agreement and Withdrawal filed October 26, 2005, by AAFV and Lynch



ARE GRANTED and the associated Settlement Agreements ARE APPROVED. The tech box applications filed by Lexington Park (File No. BNP-20040129ATQ) and Lynch (File Nos. BNP-20040130ABH, BNP-20040130ABI, BNP-20040130ABJ, and BNP-20040130ABX) ARE DISMISSED. The Form 301 long-form application (File No. BMJP-20051031AFO) and the tech box application (File No. BMJP-20040130APA) filed by AAFV ARE DISMISSED, per the applicant's request, and Citicasters' Petition to Deny these applications IS DISMISSED AS MOOT.
