Dear Mr. Devine:

This letter concerns your request, filed on May 21, 2009, on behalf of Portland Broadcasting, L.L.C. ("PB") for Special Temporary Authority ("STA") to permit Station KXPC-FM to remain silent.

PB's request states that KXPC-FM went silent on May 20, 2009, due to technical difficulties. Your request includes the appropriate certification regarding Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988.

PB's request will be granted. Accordingly, Special Temporary Authority is granted to permit Station KXPC-FM to remain silent not to exceed May 20, 2010. Notwithstanding the grant of this Special Temporary Authority, the broadcast license for KXPC-FM will automatically expire as a matter of law if broadcast operations do not commence by 12:01 a.m. on May 21, 2010. See Section 312(g) of the Communications Act, 47 U.S.C. Section 312(g).

The station's silent status does not suspend the licensee's obligation to comply with all other relevant Commission rules, including the filing, when appropriate, of applications for renewal of broadcast license. Finally, we note that it is imperative to the
