Dear Counsel:

This is in reference to the request filed November 20, 2009, on behalf of Salt of the Earth Broadcasting, Inc. ("SEB"). SEB requests further extension of the special temporary authority ("STA") granted on March 21, 2008, to operate Station KWWJ with parameters at variance and/or reduced power while maintaining monitor points within licensed limits.¹ In support of the request, SEB states that KWWJ wishes to continue to operate in service to the public and requires an sta in order to do so as it undertakes its repair efforts.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.

Our review indicates that the licensee has made progress toward restoration of licensed operation, but additional time is required for completing the work. Thus, extension of STA is warranted.

Accordingly, the request for extension of STA IS HEREBY GRANTED. Station KWWJ may continue to operate with parameters at variance and/or reduced power while maintaining monitor

¹ KWWJ is licensed for operation on 1360 kHz with 5 kilowatts daytime and 1 kilowatt nighttime, employing different directional antenna patterns daytime and nighttime (DA-2-U).

points within licensed limits. It will be necessary to further reduce power or cease operation if complaints of interference are received. SEB must notify the Commission when licensed operation is restored.² SEB must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47 CFR § 1.1310.

This authority expires on **June 7, 2010**.
