Request For Special Temporary Authority To Remain Silent

Dear Mr. Brown:

This letter concerns the request, filed on October 8, 2009, on behalf of The Cedarville University ("Cedarville") for Special Temporary Authority to permit FM Translator Station W213AO to remain silent.

Cedarville's request states that W213AO went silent on September 8, 2009, due to the station's loss of its transmitter site. Cedarville's request includes the appropriate certification regarding Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988.

Cedarville's request will be granted. Accordingly, Special Temporary Authority is granted to permit Station W213AO to remain silent for a period not to exceed 180 days from the date of this letter. Notwithstanding the grant of this special temporary authority, the broadcast license for W213AO will automatically expire as a matter of law if broadcast operations do not commence by 12:01 a.m., September 9, 2010. See Section 312(g) of the Communications Act, 47 U.S.C. Section 312(g).

² Notification of resumption of broadcast operations must be mailed to:

The station's silent status does not suspend the licensee's obligation to comply with all other relevant Commission rules, including the filing, when appropriate, of applications for renewal of broadcast license. Finally, we note that it is imperative to the safety of air navigation that any prescribed painting and illumination of the station's tower shall be maintained until removed. *See* 47 C.F.R. Sections 17.6 and 73.1740(a)(4).
