Dear Counsel:

This is in reference to the request filed January 19, 2007, on behalf of Media One Communications, Inc. (MOC). MOC requests reinstatement of the special temporary authority (STA) granted on October 1, 2004, and modified on May 6, 2005, to operate Station WRNE with emergency antenna facilities due to the destruction of one of its towers by a hurricane.<sup>1</sup>

In support of the request, MOC states that reconstruction of the licensed facilities has been delayed by adverse weather conditions, fires, flooding and desertion of the project by the contractor.

We note that the previous STA expired on August 21, 2006. Our review indicates that the circumstances presented warrant grant of STA in order to provide for service to the public, and that the requested STA facilities are the same as were previously authorized. However, in light of the lapse of time between the expiration of the prior STA and the filing of the instant request, it will be considered as a request for a new STA; the authority granted will not cover the period between the expiration of the prior STA and the filing of the instant request.

Accordingly, the request for STA IS HEREBY GRANTED. Station WRNE may operate during nighttime hours with an emergency nondirectional antenna and reduced power not to exceed 0.25 kilowatt. It will be necessary to further reduce power or cease operation if complaints of interference are received. MOC must notify the Commission when licensed operation is restored. MOC must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from

<sup>1</sup> WRNE is licensed (BL-20050210AWZ) for operation on 980 kHz with 4 kilowatts daytime and 1 kilowatt nighttime, employing a directional antenna during nighttime hours only (DA-N-U).

exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47 CFR § 1.1310. The authority granted herein does not cover the period between August 21, 2006, and January 19, 2007, and is without prejudice as to whatever action the Commission may take with respect to operation of Station WRNE during the foregoing period.

This authority expires on **August 14, 2007**.
