Dear Mr. Shubert:

This letter is in reference to the above-captioned minor change application filed by Indigo to increase daytime power from 1.1 kW to 5 kW. We noted that Indigo was granted authority to remain silent as of July 18, 2008. As a result, Indigo is reminded that the WLTQ license and all pending applications will be cancelled if the station does not resume operations and notify the Commission in writing before July 18, 2009.

A preliminary review of the application reveals that the proposed 0.005 mV/m daytime groundwave contours exceeds the permissible 26db ratio to the protected 0.1 mV/m daytime groundwave contour of co-channel Class A station CMHC, 730, Camaguey 2, Cuba, partially over land. Because CMHC is on the Master Register, and has been accepted by the International Frequency Registration Board of the International Telecommunications Union (ITU), it must be fully protected in accordance with all international regulations. Consequently, the proposal has been notified to the ITU by the FCC's International Bureau staff in March 2008. Since the ITU notification is a very lengthy process and may only result in an objection which will require the applicant to amend this application, we suggest that Indigo amend the application to eliminate the Cuban problem. If Indigo intends to wait for ITU clearance, Indigo must submit a letter acknowledging the ITU delay and agreeing to wait for ITU clearance.

Further action on the subject application will be withheld for a period of thirty days from the date of this letter to provide an opportunity to respond or amend the application. Failure to respond will result in the dismissal of the application pursuant to Section 73.3568 of the Commission's rules.
