
This refers to the above-referenced application for a proposed new FM translator station to serve Carson City, Nevada, filed by Comtech Ventures, Inc (Comtech") and the petition to deny that application filed by Tri-Valley Broadcasting ("Tri-Valley"), licensee of Translator Station K272DA, Homewood, California. The petition alleges that operation of the translator would cause interference to translator K272DA.

By letter filed July 13, 1994, Tri-Valley requested that its petition to deny be withdrawn. Section 73.3588 of the Commission's Rules outlines our procedures for the withdrawal of petitions to deny. Pursuant to Section 73.3588(a), both Comtech and Tri-Valley have submitted affidavits declaring that no money or other consideration has been paid or promised in exchange for Tri-Valley's withdrawal of the petition. We will, therefore, grant Tri-Valley's request and dismiss its petition to deny.

The application has been fully processed and found to conform to the Commission's Rules. In that regard, we find that grant of the application would serve the public interest, convenience and necessity.

Accordingly, pursuant to Sections 73.3588 and 0.283 of the Commission's Rules, the petition to deny filed by Tri-Valley Broadcasting IS DISMISSED and the above-referenced construction permit application of Comtech Ventures, Inc. for a new FM Translator Station to serve Carson City, Nevada (BPFT-931216TA) IS GRANTED.
