FM BROADCAST STATION CONSTRUCTION PERMIT

Subject to the provisions of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, treaties, and Commission Rules, and further subject to the conditions set forth in this permit,¹ authority is hereby granted to construct an FM broadcast station located and described as follows:
