Dear Applicant:

This concerns your above-referenced applications for new low power television stations. You did not include the requisite filing fees with your applications. You claim that your applications are exempt pursuant to Section 1.1114 of the Commission's Rules because the applicant is a "noncommercial educational licensee." Low power television stations are not licensed on a noncommercial educational basis. See Reexamination of the Comparative Standards for Noncommercial Educational Applicants, Second Report and Order, 18 FCC Rcd 6691, 6698 (2003). Therefore, as an applicant for a low power television station, you do not qualify for a fee exemption. Noncommercial educational full power television stations applying for low power television stations may qualify separately for a fee exemption. See 47 C.F.R. § 1.1114(d). Our records do not indicate that BETTER LIFE TELEVISION, INC. is the licensee of a noncommercial educational full power television station. Therefore, you also do not qualify under this separate fee exemption. For the above-referenced reasons, the above-referenced applications ARE DISMISSED.
