Journal Broadcast Corporation hereby notifies the Commission of the commencement of digital broadcasting by KFAQ using iBiquity Digital Corporation's HD Radio technology.

Journal Broadcast Corporation hereby supplies the following information in support of this notification:

- 1. Journal Broadcast Corporation commenced digital broadcasting on May 28, 2008.
- 2. Journal Broadcast Corporation hereby certifies its facilities conform to the iBiquity Digital Corporation specifications for hybrid digital operation by AM stations. The primary digital carrier power has been reduced by 2 dB from the maximum level specified in the iBiquity standard to minimize self interference problems.

- Journal Broadcast Corporation hereby certifies its analog transmitter output power remains at the authorized values of 50 kilowatts day and 52.65 kilowatts night after commencement of digital operations.
- 5. Journal Broadcast Corporation hereby certifies that its digital operations will not cause human exposure to levels of radio frequency radiation in excess of the levels specified in Section 1.1310 of the Commission's rules and is therefore categorically excluded from environmental processing pursuant to Section 1.1306(b) of the FCC Rules.
