Special Temporary Authority

Dear Counsel:

This is in reference to the request filed July 9, 2010, on behalf of Pennsylvania Media Associates, Inc. ("PMA"). PMA requests further extension of the special temporary authority ("STA") granted on January 6, 2006, for operation of Station WBZW with parameters at variance and/or reduced power while maintaining monitor points within licensed limits. In support of the request, PMA states that it has completed repairs and has filed an application for direct measurement of operating power.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.

Our review indicates that the licensee has made substantial progress toward restoration of licensed operation. Thus, extension of STA is warranted to allow time for processing of pending Application BZ-20100714ACX.

Accordingly, the request for extension of STA IS HEREBY GRANTED. Station WBZW may

continue to operate with parameters at variance and/or reduced power while maintaining monitor points within licensed limits. It will be necessary to further reduce power or cease operation if complaints of interference are received. PMA must notify the Commission when licensed operation is restored.² PMA must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47 CFR § 1.1310.

This authority expires on February 11, 2011.
