Dear Mr. Oxenford:

This letter addresses the September 2, 2010, request, filed on behalf of MW Springmo, Inc., ("MW Springmo"), licensee of stations KOMG(FM), Ozark, Missouri. MW Springmo requests a temporary waiver of Section 73.3556(a) of the Commission's Rules¹ to permit KOMG(FM)'s to simulcast the programming of commonly-owned Station KOSP(FM), Willard, Missouri, for a two-week period commencing on September 13, 2010. MW Springmo requests the waiver to promote a transition of KOSP(FM)'s programming format to KOMG(FM)'s frequency (92.9 MHz), and the two-week waiver will allow KOSP(FM)'s audience time to get accustomed to the new location on the radio dial.

In view of the brief period of time requested, it appears that the proposed waiver will have no adverse effect on economic competition or on other aspects of competition and diversity in the Honolulu, Hawaii, market.² Under these circumstances, we find that a limited waiver of the provision of Section 73.3556(a), which prohibits program duplication on KOMG(FM) and KOSP(FM), is consistent with the public interest.

Accordingly, MW Springmo's September 2, 2010, request IS HEREBY GRANTED, and Section 73.3556(a) of the Rules IS HEREBY WAIVED to the extent of permitting KOMG(FM) to simulcast the programming of KOSP(FM) for a period of two weeks from September 13 through September 27, 2010.
