Re: Experimental Operation of Conditional Access WXXI Public Broadcasting Counsel WXXI(FM), Rochester NY Facility ID No. 74218

Dear Ms. Dortch:

The WXXI Public Broadcasting Counsel hereby requests experimental authority for noncommercial educational radio station WXXI (FM) to conduct tests of the HD Radio system using conditional access transmission on the HD-3 multicast channel. experimental authority is requested pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 73.1510 for a period of three months.

The requested operation with conditional access HD Radio is to be conducted in conjunction with National Public Radio (NPR) as part of a study of the system for radio reading services for the blind and physically handicapped. Programming will be supplied by Reachout Radio, of Rochester NY, which currently provides radio reading service programming via SCA subcarrier on WXXI. The planned tests will evaluate the usability of new conditional access receivers by users, the sound quality and signal coverage capabilities. A copy of the report, detailing test procedures and technical findings, will be provided to the Commission at the conclusion of experimental operation.

All testing will be conducted on WXXI's regular transmitter system. Because the HD-3 emission is added on digital subcarriers closer to center of the FM channel, and because the spectral power density will not be increased relative to the present primary main digital subcarriers, it is expected there will be no effect to interference potential of other stations. However, all testing will be conducted on a non-interference basis and in compliance with the NRSC-5-B Standard. The Commission's Public Notice DA-05-609 specifies that no filing fee is required to accompany this request; and in any event, WXXI is exempt from filing fees because it is a noncommercial educational licensee.
