Dear Mr. Margolis:

This letter concerns the request, filed on July 26, 2010, on behalf of Town of Monroe, Connecticut ("Town of Monroe"), for Special Temporary Authority to permit FM Translator Station W220CE to remain silent.

Town of Monroe's request states that W220CE went silent on July 25, 2010, due to relocation of its transmitter site. Town of Monroe's request includes the appropriate certification regarding Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988.

Town of Monroe's request will be granted. Accordingly, Special Temporary Authority is granted to permit FM Translator Station W220CE to remain silent for a period not to exceed 180 days from the date of this letter. Notwithstanding the grant of this special temporary authority, the broadcast license for W220CE will automatically expire as a matter of law if broadcast operations do not commence by 12:01 a.m. July 26, 2011. See Section 312(g) of the Communications Act, 47 U.S.C. Section 312(g).

The station's silent status does not suspend the licensee's obligation to comply with all other relevant Commission rules, including the filing, when appropriate, of
