Dear Counsel:

This is in reference to the request filed October 20, 2010, on behalf of CCR-St. George IV, LLC ("CCR"). CCR requests further extension of the special temporary authority ("STA") granted on September 23, 2009, to operate Station KUNF with reduced power.<sup>1</sup> In support of the request, CCR states that lack of availability of parts has slowed the repair process.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.

Our review indicates that the licensee has made progress toward restoration of licensed operation, but additional time is required for completing the work. Thus, extension of STA is warranted.

Accordingly, the request for extension of STA IS HEREBY GRANTED. Station KUNF may continue to operate with reduced power. It will be necessary to further reduce power or cease

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<sup>1</sup> KUNF is licensed for operation on 1210 kHz with 10 kilowatts daytime and 0.25 kilowatt nighttime, employing a nondirectional antenna (ND-2-U). Construction Permit BP-20100430ABZ authorizes relocation of the transmitter, an increase in antenna height and a reduction in nighttime operating power to 0.231 kilowatt.

operation if complaints of interference are received. CCR must notify the Commission when licensed operation is restored.<sup>2</sup> CCR must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47 CFR § 1.1310.

This authority expires on **May 4, 2011**.
