Dear Mr. Macintosh:

This letter concerns your request, filed on February 7, 2011, on behalf of Horizon Christian Fellowship ("Horizon") for extension of Special Temporary Authority to permit FM Translator Station W227AS to remain silent.

Commission records reflect that W227AS went silent on May 28, 2010, due to financial difficulty. The previous STA was granted on August 30, 2010, and expired on February 28, 2011. Horizon requests extension of its STA due to continued financial difficulty. The request includes the appropriate certification regarding Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988.

Horizon's request will be granted. Accordingly, Special Temporary Authority is granted to permit Station W227AS to remain silent for a period not to exceed May 28, 2011. **Notwithstanding the grant of this special temporary authority, the broadcast license for W227AS will automatically expire as a matter of law if broadcast operations do not commence by 12:01 a.m. on May 29, 2011.**¹ See Section 312(g) of the Communications Act, 47 U.S.C. Section 312(g).

The station's silent status does not suspend the licensee's obligation to comply with all other relevant Commission rules, including the filing, when appropriate, of applications for renewal of broadcast license. Finally, we note that it is imperative to the safety of air navigation that any prescribed painting and illumination of the station's tower shall be maintained until removed. See 47 C.F.R. Sections 17.6 and 73.1740(a)(4).
