Request For Special Temporary Authority To Remain Silent

Dear Mr. Lusko:

This letter concerns the request, filed on May 17, 2011, on behalf of Fresh Life Church, Inc., for Special Temporary Authority to permit FM Translator Station K296EM remain silent.

Fresh Life Church, Inc.'s, request states that K296EM went silent on May 18, 2011, due to the loss of the station's programming source. Fresh Life Church, Inc.'s, request includes the appropriate certification regarding Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988.<sup>1</sup>

Fresh Life Church, Inc.'s, request will be granted. Accordingly, Special Temporary Authority is granted to permit FM Translator Station K296EM to remain silent for a period not to exceed 180 days from the date of this letter. Notwithstanding the grant of this special temporary authority, the broadcast license for K296EM will automatically expire as a matter of law if broadcast operations do not commence by 12:01 am., May 19, 2012. See Section 312(g) of the Communications Act, 47 U.S.C. Section 312(g).

The station's silent status does not suspend the licensee's obligation to comply with all other relevant Commission rules, including the filing, when appropriate, of applications for renewal of broadcast license. Finally, we note that it is imperative to the safety of air navigation that any prescribed painting and illumination of the station's tower shall be maintained until removed. *See* 47 C.F.R. Sections 17.6 and 73.1740(a)(4).
