Dear Licensees:

This is with respect to the above-referenced application for a construction permit for a new digital low power television station on channel 5 at Logan, Utah, filed by MCUSA, Inc. Bonneville Holding Company, the licensee of KSL-TV, Salt Lake City, Utah, filed an informal objection.

Digital television stations have both an RF or major channel number and a PSIP or virtual channel number. The RF number is the channel number allotted to each full-power television station pursuant to Section 73.622(i) of the Commission's rules. The PSIP or virtual channel number is the channel number assigned to each full-power television station pursuant to the PSIP Standard, and is the channel number viewers input into their television sets in order to view a particular television station. Station KLS-TV is transmitting on RF channel 38 with PSIP channel 5, and its programming is also distributed through a network of television translator stations. One of its television translator stations, K45GL-D, channel 45, Logan, Utah, also uses channel 5 as its PSIP channel and Bonneville requests that the Commission require MCUSA to employ a PSIP channel that does not conflict with Bonneville's stations. In response, MCUSA suggests that it be allowed to use channel 1 as its PSIP channel at Logan.

The PSIP Standard "guarantee[s] that the two-part channel number combinations used by a broadcaster will be different from those used by any other broadcaster with an overlapping DTV service area." It appears there will be overlap between K45GL-D and MCUSA's proposed facility. Therefore, pursuant to the PSIP Standard, MCUSA will be assigned PSIP channel 45, the RF channel for K45GL.
