Request for Special Temporary  
Authority to Remain Silent

Dear Ms. Frazier:

This letter concerns the request you filed on April 15, 2011, on behalf of Young Harris Broadcasting, Inc. ("YHB"), for Special Temporary Authority to permit AM Radio Station WYHG to remain silent.

YHB's request states that Station WYHG(AM) went silent on April 15, 2011, for financial reasons. The request includes the appropriate certification regarding Section 5301 of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988.

YHB's request is granted. Accordingly, Special Temporary Authority is granted to permit Station WYHG(AM) to remain silent until April 15, 2012. **Notwithstanding the grant of this Special Temporary Authority, the broadcast license for Station WYHG(AM) will automatically expire as a matter of law if broadcast operations do not commence by 12:01 a.m., April 16, 2012.**<sup>1</sup> See Section 312(g) of the Communications Act, 47 U.S.C. § 312(g).


The station's silent status does not suspend the licensee's obligation to comply with all other relevant Commission rules, including the filing, when appropriate, of applications for

renewal of broadcast license. Finally, we note that it is imperative to the safety of air navigation that any prescribed painting and illumination of the station's tower shall be maintained until removed. *See* 47 C.F.R. §§ 17.6 and 73.1740(a)(4).
