
This is in reference to the captioned application for modification of the license of WMBL(FM), Mitchell, Indiana filed by Moody Bible Institute of Chicago ("Moody"). The application, *inter alia*, contains a request to modify a main studio waiver specified in the original construction permit (BPED-19961108MA) for WMBL(FM) and which was granted on September 9, 1998. That waiver authorized WMBL(FM) to operate as a satellite station of WGNR(FM), Moline, Illinois. Moody now seeks to specify noncommercial educational station, WJGG(FM), Monee, Illinois as the originating station.


In a January 20, 2004 amendment to the application, you state that the change in originating station is necessary because Moody has determined that it is more economical to operate WMBL(FM) as a satellite of WJGG(FM) and that it will be better able to serve the problems, needs, and interests of Mitchell, Indiana. You further indicate that Moody's previous commitments to the Commission made for the operation of WMBL(FM) as a satellite station remain unchanged.

Moody is reminded that the public inspection file for WMBL(FM) must now be maintained at the main studio of the new "parent" station, WJGG(FM), Monee, Illinois and that the WMBL(FM) public inspection file must contain the quarterly issues and programs list for Mitchell, Indiana.

Accordingly, the main studio waiver request and the modification of license (BMLED-20030806ABZ), filed by Moody Bible Institute of Chicago, being in all respects acceptable, ARE HEREBY GRANTED.
