Dear Licensee:

By letters dated December 22, 2011, the Deputy Chief of the Video Division cancelled the five above-referenced low power television stations pursuant to Section 312(g) of the Communications Act of 1934,¹ which provides for automatic expiration of the license of any broadcast station that fails to transmit broadcast signals for any consecutive 12-month period. Commission records showed that each station had ceased operations between November 4 and November 15, 2010.

Tiger Eye Broadcasting Corporation, the licensee of the stations, filed petitions for reconsideration of the cancellations, stating that each station had resumed operations for a short period of time prior to the automatic expiration date, but that Tiger Eye "inadvertently failed to file the required resumption of notice" On March 6, 2012, at the request of the staff, Tiger Eye filed a supplement to its petitions, setting forth the steps it had taken to convert the five stations to digital operations, and estimating that it would be able to complete construction of all five stations by October 2012.

In view of the foregoing, the petitions for reconsideration ARE GRANTED, and the licenses and digital construction permits ARE REINSTATED. Tiger Eye IS FURTHER REQUIRED to file monthly reports with the Commission reporting on the status of the construction each station. The first report must be filed by May 1, 2012 with the Office of the Secretary, Attention: Hossein Hashemzadeh, Deputy Chief, Video Division, Media Bureau.
