Dear Counsel:

This is in reference to the request filed February 1, 2012, on behalf of Public Broadcasting of Colorado, Inc. (PBC) PBC requests further extension of the special temporary authority (STA) originally granted on April 21, 1999, to operate Station KCFR-FM (formerly KVOD) with reduced power and a modified antenna.

In support of the request, PBC states that good cause exists for further extension of STA.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.

Our review indicates that the licensee has been prevented from restoring licensed operation due to causes beyond its control and has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem. Thus, extension of STA is warranted.

In view of the above, the request for extension of STA IS HEREBY GRANTED. Station KCFR-FM may continue to operate with reduced power and with a modified antenna, pending resolution of the RFR issues. PBC must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47 CFR § 1.1310.

This authority expires on **October 30, 2012**.
