Dear Licensee:

This is with respect to station KPAL-LP, Palmdale, California, licensed to KPAL Television, Inc. Section 312(g) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended,<sup>1</sup> provides that:

If a broadcasting station fails to transmit broadcast signals for any consecutive 12-month period, then the station license granted for the operation of that broadcast station expires at the end of that period, notwithstanding any provision, term or condition of the license to the contrary . . .

Commission records indicate that KPAL-LP has been silent since June 17, 2011.<sup>2</sup> Accordingly, the license for KPAL-LP and the construction permit for digital companion channel station KPAL-LD ARE HEREBY CANCELLED, the call signs ARE DELETED and the above-referenced applications ARE HEREBY DISMISSED.
