## Dear Counsel:

On February 23, 2012, you submitted a Joint Motion to Accept Settlement Agreement, Dismiss Application of Civic Light, Inc., and Grant Application of Entravision Holdings, LLC (Joint Motion), to remove the mutual exclusivity between the above-referenced applications filed by Civic Light, Inc. (Civic), the licensee of low power television station KZTC-LP, San Diego, California, and Entravision Holdings, LLC (Entravision), the licensee of Class A television station KTCD-CA, San Diego, California. Specifically, you request that the Commission approve the Settlement Agreement, dated February 15, 2012, between Civic and Entravision and take appropriate action with respect to the applications.

Upon review of your Settlement Agreement and related documents, we find that it complies with Section 311(c) of the Communications Act and Section 73.3588 of the Commission's rules. Furthermore, we find that the applicants are fully qualified and conclude that the requested Commission action with respect to the applications would serve the public interest.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED, That the application of Civic Light, Inc., for a construction permit for digital displacement facilities for low power television station KZTC-LP,

San Diego, California, File No. BDISDTL-20090630ABO, is DISMISSED. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That the application of Entravision Holdings, LLC, for a construction permit for digital displacement facilities for Class A television station KTCD-CA, San Diego, California, File No. BDISDTA-20090611ACQ, is GRANTED.
