**Notice of Apparent Liability
Application for Review**

Dear Counsel:

This letter concerns a Notice of Apparent Liability (“NAL”) issued on February 12, 2007, to West Texas A&M University, licensee of Station KWTS, Canyon, Texas (“Station”), for willfully violating Section 73.3539 of the Commission’s Rules (“Rules”) by failing to timely file a license renewal application for the Station, and for willfully and repeatedly violating Section 301 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (“Act”), by engaging in unauthorized operation of the Station after its authorization had expired.¹ An Application for Review of that NAL was filed on April 18, 2011, and remains pending.

The Notice of Apparent Liability is hereby CANCELLED. West Texas A&M University is instead hereby ADMONISHED for its violations of Section 73.3539 of the Rules and of Section 301 of the Act.
