Bloomsburg University's FM station 91.1 WBUQ went off air on February 6, 2013. Our transmitter had a shorted MOSFET and the +50 volt power supply is not functioning properly. Furthermore, the station's processor/stereo generator also had a bad power supply, and required replacement. Moving both items from our station required us to go silent for a short period of time. We have already shipped both parts out for repair to the manufacturer in New Jersey. We were told that the parts would take about two weeks to repair.

Once we receive the items, they will be tested, and re-installed into our transmitter room, and this will hopefully put us back on air without any further problems. Our tower obstruction lighting is functioning properly. I will notify the Commission when we do resume our broadcast.
