Towson University ("Towson"), licensee of WMJF-LP, a Class A television station licensed to Towson, MD, hereby responds to the recent letter from the Video Division of the Commission's Media Bureau concerning the above-referenced application ("Channel 19 displacement application"). See Letter of Hossein Hashemzadeh, Deputy Chief, Video Division, No. 1800E1-SSA (dated Apr. 1, 2012) ("FCC Letter"). The FCC Letter indicates that the Channel 19 displacement application "does not comply with the Commission's interference rules." Id. Specifically, the agency's staff determined that the proposed Channel 19 facility in Towson would "cause objectionable interference to "the protected area of the Land Mobile service to the following facilities: Wash[ington] (MD & VA) DC on Channel 18 [and] Philadelphia, PA on Channel 19." Id. (indirect reference to 47 C.F.R. § 74.709(c) prohibition on low-power TV facilities "within the protected contour of a co-channel or first adjacent channel land mobile assignment" in certain metropolitan areas).

In light of the FCC's determination that the Channel 19 displacement application implicates co-channel and first adjacent channel interference protections for land mobile licensees in specified locations, see 47 C.F.R. § 74.709(a), Towson requests that the Commission dismiss the Channel 19 application and instead promptly process the new application that Towson has just filed for a digital companion channel (File No. BDCCDTL-20130329ACY). Towson remains eager to complete its transition to digital broadcast operations as quickly as possible.
