Dear Mr. Lipp:

This is in reference to the request filed on May 13, 2013. MRB requests further extension of the STA granted on January 13, 2009, to operate Station KYPA pursuant to Section 73.1615. In support of the request, MRB states that the license application (BMML-20111209KKR) remains pending before the Commission, and it expects to complete all necessary modifications soon (which should allow the Commission to grant PTA).

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.

Accordingly, the request for extension of STA IS HEREBY GRANTED. Station KYPA may continue to operate pursuant to Section 73.1615 and the terms and conditions of Construction Permit BP-20050228ACB. In particular, the following modes of operation are authorized:

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> KYPA is licensed for 1 kW non-directional unlimited hours operation on 1230 kHz, and BP-20050228ACB authorized relocation to the KBLA(AM) transmitter site with a 1 kW directional unlimited hours operation.

- 1) With the substantially directional pattern and power authorized by the permit.
- 2) With a temporary nondirectional antenna and reduced power not to exceed 0.25 kilowatt, only as necessary to facilitate the authorized relocation of Station KHJ to the site.

It will be necessary to further reduce power or cease operation if complaints of interference are received. MRB must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47 CFR § 1.1310.

This authority expires on December 12, 2013.
