Dear Counsel:

This is with respect to the above referenced applications filed by Gulf-California Broadcast Company for digital low power television station KCWQ-LD, Palm Spring, California, to license its constructed facility and increase the maximum effective radiated power. On December 4, 2013, San Bernardino Community College District ("SBCCD") filed a Motion to Withdraw all pending Informal Objections (and related pleadings) filed in opposition to the aforementioned applications. In its Motion to Withdraw, SBCCD states that its "concerns regarding interference by KCWQ-LD to the input reception of its television relator station KJHP-LP…have been resolved by way of alternate delivery…." SBCCD's Motion to Withdraw is also accompanied by an affidavit making the necessary statements required by 47 C.F.R. § 73.3588. We find SBCCD's Motion to Withdraw to be sufficient.

Accordingly, San Bernardino Community College District's Motion to Withdraw and the above referenced applications **ARE GRANTED**.
