Dear Mr. Goetz:

By letter dated September 25, 2013, the Video Division cancelled the license of station WDWW-LP, Cleveland, Georgia and the construction permit for a digital companion channel at Atlanta, Georgia, because the license had expired and you failed to file an application for renewal of license by December 1, 2012 in accordance with Section 73.3539 of the Commission's rules. You filed a timely petition for reconsideration stating that you did not receive the Commission's August 9, 2013 letter informing you of the need to file a renewal application because it was sent to the wrong address. You further request that the license be reinstated because the station provides educational and emergency information to the public. You also requested and received Special Temporary Authorization to continue operations, and filed a renewal application.

In view of the foregoing, the petition for reconsideration IS GRANTED and the license and construction permit ARE REINSTATED. Because you did not file your renewal application until October 21, 2013, this constitutes a violation of Section 73.3539 of our rules. Although we do not rule out more severe sanctions for a violation of this nature in the future, we have determined that an admonition is appropriate at this time. Therefore, based upon the facts and circumstances before us, we ADMONISH you for this violation. We remind you that the Commission expects all television licensees to comply with its application filing deadlines.
