To Whom It May Concern:

This letter is written in compliance with the requirements of Section 73.1250, paragraph (e), FCC Rules and Regulations, regarding notification of the use of daytime facilities during night hours in emergency situations.

On the morning of January 24, 2014 WVMR signed on at 6:00 AM at our regular operating power of 5,000 watts at the request of the Pocahontas Board of Education, to notify parents and students that Pocahontas County schools were closed due to snowy road conditions in parts of Pocahontas County.

These emergency broadcasts continued until our regular sign on time of 7:30AM, at which time we returned to normal programming. During the period of emergency operation, we broadcast school closing announcements per the request of county school officials.

WVMR is a non-commercial station which provides the only local broadcast service to Pocahontas County's 950 square miles of isolated mountainous terrain. There is no other broadcast station, radio or television, which covers as much as half our county within its primary coverage area.
