Dear Mr. Hashemzadeh:

Rocky Mountain Public Broadcasting Network, Inc. (RMPBN) received your letter of February 5, 2014 regarding the three translators, listed above, for which RMPBN did not file a renewal application. RMPBN has abandoned all three of these translators, as described below, and no longer has a need for the license authorizations.

RMPBN originally rebroadcasted KRMA's signal in Boulder, CO using analog translator K44CT but replaced it in 2008 with digital translator K24HQ-D (Fac. ID 167431). Similarly, in 2010, we replaced analog translator K06LX (Glenwood Springs) with K45KC-D (Fac. ID 167430) to rebroadcast KRMJ's signal on channel 46. With regard to Durango analog translator K29CZ, we upgraded to a full-service transmitter KRMU (Fac. ID 84224), for which we were granted a license to cover in 2005.

Thus, RMPBN has abandoned translators K44CT, K06LX, and K29CZ, and no longer operates those stations. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to contact us in-house at 303-620-5704 or our outside counsel, Mark Balkin, at (985) 629-0750.
