Dear Counsel:

This is in reference to the request filed May 15, 2014, on behalf of Montgomery Broadcasting Company ("MBC"). MBC explains that WPRT-FM's antenna suffered a catastrophic failure on May 6, 2014, and that the licensee re-commenced broadcasting with an emergency antenna, consisting of the licensed facilities of FM translator W271AB, to resume operation on Channel 273 with reduced coverage. (See our May 15 letter granting Special Temporary Authority to WPRT-FM for a 90 day period, BSTA-20140515AGJ.) The current filing requests use of a temporary antenna, mounted lower on the tower at the licensed transmitter site, to maintain reduced operations by FM translator W271AB on Channel 271 while the licensed facility is in use by WPRT-FM.

The request for STA IS HEREBY GRANTED. Station WPRT-FM may operate with the following temporary facilities:



The STA request also requests authority for the translator STA facility to relay co-owned WBUZ HD3 in place of WPRT-FM HD2, during the STA period. We have no objection to this change during the term of the STA. When licensed operations resume, the primary station for this translator shall revert back to WPRT-FM HD2.

MBC must notify the Commission when licensed operation is restored. MBC must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from radiofrequency exposure in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47 CFR § 1.1310.

This authority expires on **August 17, 2014**.
