Dear Mr. Langham:

This is in reference to the request filed on January 10, 2014. CCBL requests further extension of the STA originally granted on April 16, 2008, to operate with parameters at variance and/or reduced power while maintaining monitor points within licensed limits.<sup>1</sup> In support of the request, CCBL states that it has completed a partial proof to verify operating parameters.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.

Accordingly, the request for extension of STA IS HEREBY GRANTED. Station WODT



may continue to operate with parameters at variance and/or reduced power while maintaining monitor points within licensed limits. It will be necessary to further reduce power or cease operation if complaints of interference are received. CCBL must notify the Commission when licensed operation is restored.<sup>2</sup> CCBL must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47 CFR § 1.1310. A reduced amount of time is being granted since we anticipate resumption of licensed operations should occur before the expiration date shown below (since an acceptable FCC Form 302 direct measurement of power application should be filed soon).

This authority expires on **May 19, 2014**.
