Dear Mr. Lipp:

This is in reference to the request filed on August 15, 2014. Cumulus requests an eighth extension of the STA granted on June 8, 2010, to operate Station WXQW with parameters at variance and/or reduced power while maintaining monitor points within licensed limits due to one damaged tower.¹ In support of the request, Cumulus stated that it did not replace the tower primarily due to the high cost, and that the AM Revitalization proceeding (MB Docket 13-249) would provide better options for reinstating improved nighttime service.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:


- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.

¹ WXQW is licensed for operation on 660 kHz with 10 kW day (ND) and 0.85 kW night (DA).

Accordingly, the request for extension of STA IS HEREBY GRANTED. Station WXQW may continue to operate with parameters at variance and/or reduced power while maintaining monitor points within licensed limits. It will be necessary to further reduce power or cease operation if complaints of interference are received. Cumulus must file an acceptable FCC Form 301 application when the AM Revitalization proceeding is adopted and then notify the Commission when licensed operation is restored.² Cumulus must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. *See* 47 CFR § 1.1310.

This authority expires on **March 10, 2015**.
