OPPOSITION TO PETITION TO DENY

CITY OF TRUTH ("TRUTH"), by its Chief Executive Officer, herewith submits its OPPOSITION to the petition to deny the referenced application for construction permit.

- 1. The "Petition to Deny" is not supported by an affidavit or declaration of a party with personal knowledge of the facts alleged. It is supported only by the Declaration of Alan Korn who is the attorney for the petitioner. It is our understanding of the rules that a petition to deny must be supported by such an affidavit or declaration and not by the attorney for petitioner. Absent such an affidavit or declaration, the Petition to Deny should be dismissed as a formal petition to deny. Further, based on the copy received, there does not appear to be a declaration establishing standing of the petitioner, and there does not appear to be a certificate of service as required by Commission Rules.
- 2. Petitioner's attorney alleges that it can find no proof that Truth has tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the federal tax code. Truth's understanding is that this is not necessary to be eligible to receive a permit. It is sufficient that Truth is a non-profit entity under California law without consideration of tax exempt status.

3. Petitioner incorrectly interprets Truth's divestiture commitment – which is clear.

The divestiture commitment states that Truth's CEO will divest his interest in One

Ministries - which includes KORB. Divestiture of his interest in One Ministries includes

all interests held by One Ministries and not just KORB. Mr. McMinn confirms that he will

divest of his interest in One Ministries and that such commitment is not limited to KORB.

4. Petitioner alleges that Truth has failed to adequately describe its educational

programming. Truth respectfully disagrees. Further, Truth believes that the definition of

religious programming as educational is protected by the First Amendment and, as such, is

not subject to dispute in a federal licensing proceeding.

5. Petitioner claims that Truth lacks the requisite character qualifications to be a

Commission licensee. This is based on petitioner's interpretation of the above

requirements. Truth disagrees with petitioner's interpretations and, in any event, cannot be

found to lack character qualifications for not understanding the FCC Rules in perhaps the

same way that petitioner's attorney understands them. There is simply no support in fact

for a finding that Truth lacks the requisite character qualifications to be a Commission

licensee, and the mere allegations of an attorney are certainly insufficient for such a

finding. The petition should be dismissed and/or denied.
