Dear Mr. Swift:

This is in reference to the request filed on October 16, 2014. WBI requests an extension of the STA originally granted on April 22, 2014, to operate station KCLN(AM) with emergency antenna facilities pursuant to Section 73.1680 due to the collapse of one tower.¹ In support of the request, WBI states that additional time is needed to replace the tower and resumed licensed operations.

Requests for extension of STA will be granted only where the licensee can show that one or more of the following criteria have been met:

- Restoration of licensed facilities is complete and testing is underway;
- Substantial progress has been made during the most recent STA period toward restoration of licensed operation; or
- No progress has been made during the most recent STA period for reasons clearly beyond the licensee's control, and the licensee has taken all possible steps to expeditiously resolve the problem.


Accordingly, the request for extension of STA IS HEREBY GRANTED. Station KCLN(AM) may continue to operate ND from tower #1 of the array. KCLN(AM) may operate with a daytime ND power of 0.25 kW and a nighttime power of 0.035 kW. Although the proposed radiated field strength will exceed the authorized radiation pattern along several azimuths, no impermissible interference is predicted. Therefore, allowing station KCLN(AM) to

operate temporarily at these ND power levels is in the public interest. It will be necessary to further reduce power or cease operation if complaints of interference are received. WBI must notify the Commission when licensed operation is restored.² WBI must use whatever means are necessary to protect workers and the public from exposure to radio frequency radiation in excess of the Commission's exposure guidelines. See 47 CFR § 1.1310. We anticipate that WBI will file an FCC Form 302 application before the expiration date shown below if any changes to the operating parameters are needed. Otherwise a one page letter to the attention of supervisory engineer Son Nguyen should be submitted to certify the return to licensed operating parameters per the most recent license (BL-20020628ACF).

This authority expires on **May 6, 2015**.
