I represent House District 36 in the Alaska State Legislature. My district includes the community of Akiachak, a remote, rural village of 800 people. I am writing in support of the petition of reconsideration filed by the leadership team of the Akiachak School.

A license for Akiachak's radio station, KHKY, facility ID 171129, was granted on October 11, 2007, and expired on February 1, 2014. The radio station was run by the Akiachak School, a K-12 institution serving 206 students. The previous principal of the school was not involved with the radio station and allowed the license to lapse. The school's new principal, Christopher Barr, is eager to re-start the station and is asking the FCC to reconsider its decision.

Akiachak School is part of the Yupiit School District, which is among the most challenged school district in Alaska. KHKY is a vital communication tool and will be used to build positive community relationships by spreading the school's positive message. Restarting the radio station has become a priority for the school's new administration, staff, student body, and community. The radio station would go a long way toward reestablishing the strong unity once experienced in this school district.

The school plans to utilize the radio station to create connections and strengthen collaboration between the community, student body and educational professionals. In addition, the station would be a valuable tool
