Schiavo dated April 10, 2014. A copy of this letter was not served on Temple University or its counsel and first came to Temple University's attention due to its publication in the Commission's

Fletcher, Heald & Hildreth

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Public Notice on June 13, 2014 (Report No. 28260) as an Informal Objection. Counsel was unable to obtain a copy of the letter from the Commission staff until July 10, 2014.

Mr. Schiavo has contacted Temple University regarding his concern related to his inability to obtain a strong signal in his community. Temple University has responded to Mr. Schiavo explaining the technical difficulties in providing a stronger signal to his community. Mr. Schiavo subsequently requested information as to how to contact the Commission to express his concerns and Temple University promptly responded with such requested information. Copies of this correspondence is attached for your convenience.

Temple University does not believe that Mr. Schiavo's letter is in fact an objection. As a matter of fact, in Mr. Schiavo's March 21, 2014 letter to Temple University, Mr. Schiavo expressly states that he has no objection to the license renewal but wants to comment on extending the stations' coverage. *See* Letter of Pasco L. Schiavo dated March 21, 2014.

Accordingly, Temple University requests that the Commission releases its hold on the renewal applications listed above.

Dear Mr. Schiavo:

I understand your desire for a clearer signal from WRTI. There are, however, several factors which make this difficult to accomplish.

First, Hazelton is situated amid a series of mountain ridges. FM signals travel in a line-of-sight direction, meaning that transmissions from our various stations have difficulty reaching your area.

Second, all of our transmitters and translators are operating at their legally allowable power levels, which means increases in power are not an option—although it is not a certainty that that would solve the problem of line-of-sight.

Finally, setting up a "broadcasting facility" is time consuming and expensive. We would have to determine if there were any available FM frequencies in Hazelton. Then we would have to apply to the FCC for permission to build, and if approved, secure the necessary funding---not an inconsequential sum. Of course, there are the continuing costs of maintenance, repairs and utilities.

My only suggestion at the moment is to enjoy our programming online through our website (wrti.org) or via an internet radio.

I hope this explains the current situation. We understand your concerns and hope we can count on you for continued listening and support.

Here is the text of the license renewal announcement as aired:

The Federal Communications Commission granted licenses to serve the public interest as a public trustee, until August 1st, 2014, to WRTI and WRTX on August 23rd, 2006; to WJAZ, WRTL, and WRTY on August 2nd, 2006; and to WRTJ on October 8th, 2009.

Our licenses will expire on August 1st, 2014. We must file applications for renewal with the FCC on or before April 1st, 2014. When filed, copies of these applications will be available for public inspection during our regular business hours. They will contain information concerning the performance of our stations during the past 8 years.

Individuals who wish to advise the FCC of facts relating to our renewal applications and to whether these stations have operated in the public interest should file comments and petitions with the FCC by July 1st, 2014.
