Dear Licensee:

This is in regard to the pending license renewal application of the above-captioned station. You filed a license renewal application for a Class A television station when in fact KVBA-LP is a low power television station.

As noted in the station's amended 2006 license renewal application, KVBA-LP was granted a displacement licensee on September 4, 2007 that converted the station from Class A status to low power status.¹ Indeed, the Licensee requested that the Video Division waive a multitude of public file violations during that license term as a result of the conversion.

Accordingly, the Licensee should withdraw its Class A license renewal application and file the appropriate low power television renewal.
